Families holding a valid means tested concession card or temporary foster parents are eligible to apply. In total \$225 per year will be paid for eligible Years 7 - 12 secondary school students. Payments will go directly to the school and be tied to the family account.

As part of the Victorian government's affordable school uniform program, every Year 7 government school student who is a recipient of the CSEF automatically qualifies for a uniform pack voucher.

# FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

# PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

## Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

#### Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for noncurriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

### Extracurricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

 Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



# **FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES**

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
